

The Committee on the Petition of Jacob Stansbury and others reported that it was inexpedient to grant the prayer of the Petitioners which report was read and agreed to.

The ordinance appropriating a sum of money for filling up and wharfing Lee Street was returned by the Second Branch passed.

A resolution was presented by a member from the eighth ward for including in the appropriations for 1806 a sum not exceeding five hundred and fifty Dollars for the purpose of taking up the wooden kerbs and putting down Stone in the eighth ward and that the same be expressed in the direction of the City Commissioners, which resolution being read was concurred with and thereupon was transmitted to the Second Branch and by them returned agreed to.

The Petition of the Superintendants of the pumps was read and referred to the Committee consisting of Messrs. Simpson, Stouffer and Tennant.

On motion therefor leave was given to bring in a bill entitled a further Supplement to the ordinance to regulate the inspection of hog's-lard in the City of Baltimore which was read a first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A resolution was received from the Second Branch for including two hundred Dollars in the appropriation bill for the Clerk of the Centre Market in addition to his salary granted by law, which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion leave was given to bring in a bill entitled a Supplement to an ordinance entitled an ordinance regulating the gauging of casks in the City of Baltimore which was read a first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The Committee to whom was referred the former bill reported a bill entitled a further Supplement to the ordinance for the inspection of Butter in the City of Baltimore which being read a first time was ordered to lie on the table.

A message was received from the Second Branch proposing to adjourn until ^{next} Monday afternoon at 3 o'clock. To which the first Branch assented and informed the Second Branch thereof and on motion therefor,

The Branch adjourned until next Monday afternoon at 3 o'clock.
