The Committee to whom the communication from John Hillen was referred reported ~~the~~ following to wit Resolved that an appropriation be made in the appropriation Bill for 1805 of a sum not exceeding three thousand Dollars to be expended under the Direction of the City Commissioners for the purpose of wharfing and filling up that part of Low Street in the South Ward that lies between Jones Falls and front Street which was read and agreed to and sent to the Second Branch

The Resolution that ^{be} included in the Ordinance making appropriations for the year Eighteen hundred and six a sum not exceeding four thousand Dollars for the purpose of filling up and graveling that part of the Market Space
