&c. was returned by the Second Branch agreed to with
an amendment which was to strike out \$1029 ³⁰/₁₀₀ and
insert in lieu thereof \$217 ⁰⁰/₁₀₀ which amendment
was disagreed to and the Second Branch informed
thereof.

The resolution respecting an appropriation
for the Clerk of the Centre Market was agreed to
with amendments and thereupon was transmitted
to the Second Branch.
