

9 A resolution was received from the Second Branch authorizing and requiring the City Commission to adjust so much of the account of John Mickle as arises from his filling in any of the Streets of the City under their direction and properly charge-ble to the City to the City and that they draw on the Register for the amount thereof which resolution was read agreed to and sent to the Second Branch.

The report of the joint Committee appointed to confer on the resolution for including in the bill making appropriations for the year 1806 a sum of money for the purchase of ground from William Neary to widen Little York Street <sup>extending there</sup> having taken the same into their consideration and recommending that six hundred Dollars be appropriated for that purpose, was received from the Second Branch read and agreed to with an amendment for striking out "six hundred Dollars" and inserting "five hundred Dollars" and thereupon was sent to the Second Branch.

The resolution respecting Conrad Miller's claim was received from the Second Branch who informed us they still adhere to their amend-ments thereto.

A resolution was received from the Second Branch requesting the Mayor to withhold his assent to the payment of any Street when it does not appear to him that the tax imposed for the payment of the same can be collected, unless in cases where payments are required under a Supplement to the ordinance for the more effe-tual paving Streets lanes and alleys in the City of Baltimore passed on the 10<sup>th</sup> of March 1802. which resolution was read agreed to and sent to the Second Branch

On motion therefor the Branch adjourned until next Wednesday afternoon at 3 o'clock.

Resolved that a sum not exceeding be included in the appropriation bill for the purpose of completing the filling up New Church Street between Calvert Street and North Lane under the direction of the City Commissioners; provided the proprietors of the adjoining lots fill up on each side at the same time which resolution was read and ordered to lie on the table.
