The Petition of Charles Pearce and others  
was read and referred to Messrs. Small, Stouffer and  
The reports.

The bill entitled an ordinance for increasing  
the number of lamps in the City of Baltimore was  
received from the Second Branch passed with an  
amendment, which amendment was read, agreed  
to and sent to the Second Branch with information  
thereof.

A resolution was read, adopted and sent  
to the Second Branch, for including in the appro-  
-priation bill, a sum not exceeding two hundred  
Dollars to enable the City Commissioners to pay  
Ludwig Herring such sum as he may be entitled  
to receive for piling and logging the foundation  
of the walls erected at the east end of Hawk  
and Swan Streets in the sixth ward.

A resolution was read adopted and sent to the  
Second Branch for their concurrence authorizing the  
Mayor to borrow from any of the banks a sum not  
exceeding ten thousand Dollars to be applied in aid of  
the City funds, the payment of which loan shall  
be made by the Mayor out of any unappropriated  
Money in the City Treasury and such payment is  
hereby guaranteed by the Mayor and City Council  
of Baltimore.

A resolution was read agreed to and  
sent to the Second Branch requesting the Register  
of the City to revise collate and abridge all the  
Ordinances of this corporation now in force  
for which service compensation shall be made  
by the Mayor and City Council Baltimore.

The bill entitled an ordinance making  
appropriations for the year 1806. was read a second  
time and passed and thereupon was returned to  
the Second Branch;

The bill entitled an ordinance for the pay-  
-ment of the Journal of accounts was received  
from the Second Branch read a first and by special  
order a second time and passed and thereupon  
was returned to the Second Branch.

A message was received from the Second  
Branch stating their concurrence to the amend-  
-ments to the bill making appropriations for the  
present year: and also to the resolution authorizing  
the Mayor to borrow a sum of money in aid of  
the City funds.

A message was sent to the Second Branch,  
proposing to adjourn sine die.
