The Committee to whom was re-committed the report of the Committee on the accounts of the Register City Commissioners and Commissioners of Health, made a report which was read agreed to and sent to the Second Branch and by them assented to.

On Motion therefore the Branch adjourned until tomorrow afternoon at three o'clock.
