sent to the Second Branch.

The resolution appropriating two hun-
-dred and thirty dollars to repair the Hanover
Market house was read agreed to and sent
to the Second Branch for their concurrence.

A resolution appropriating two
hundred and fifty dollars to fill up New
Church ^{Street} was read concurred with and sent
to the Second Branch for their assent.

The resolution appropriating seventy
five dollars for oiling winding up and
regulating the Town clock was read, agreed
to and sent to the Second Branch for their
concurrence.

The resolution for sweeping the
roofs of the Market Houses once a month
was adopted and sent to the Second Branch.

The bill entitled an ordinance to res-
train gaming and for licensing and regulating
theatrical and other public exhibitions, within
the City and Parishes of Baltimore was
received from the Second Branch read a
first and by special order a second time and
passed ^{with} proposed amendments.

On motion therefor the Branch
adjourned until tomorrow afternoon at
three o'clock.
