A communication from Gilbert Middleton Inspector of salted provisions was read and referred to the consideration of the Second Branch.

The communication from James Mosher and others was read and referred to the Second Branch.

A resolution for including in the appropriation bill the sum of one hundred and eight dollars to be paid William Paterson for filling up Hanover and Conway Streets in 1804 & 1805 under the direction of the City Commissioners, was read agreed to and sent to the Second Branch and by them returned agreed to.

A resolution, was read assented to and sent to the Second Branch for including in the general appropriation bill six hundred dollars for filling up and completing Conway and Lee Streets to be expended under the direction of the City Commissioners.

A message was received from the Second Branch stating that they cannot recede from their amendments for ^{purging} money for the Fire Companies.

A resolution appropriating a sum not exceeding three hundred dollars for each of the Fire Companies to be drawn from time to time by the Presidents thereof an account of the expenditures thereof shall be returned to the Register on or before the first day of February next, was received from the Second Branch read agreed to and returned to the Second Branch.

A resolution for appropriating a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars for filling up Fish Street was read agreed to and sent to the Second Branch for their concurrence.

The resolution respecting a foot bridge alongside of the Stone bridge in Wilkes Street was returned by the Second Branch agreed to with two amendments proposing to build two foot bridges instead of one and to appropriate two hundred fifty dollars instead of one hundred and fifty Dollars which amendments were read agreed to and the Second Branch informed thereof.

A message was received from the Second Branch proposing to adjourn until next Monday afternoon at three o'clock.

To which proposed adjournment the First Branch refused their concurrence and the Second Branch were informed thereof;
