The Committee appointed for that purpose reported a bill entitled an ordinance for the inspection of pot and pearl ashes which was read a first time.

The ordinance to appoint City Commissioners and prescribing their duties, was read a first and by special order a second time and passed with amendments, and thereupon was transmitted to the Second Branch which amendments were agreed to by the Second Branch except the last thereof, with which they nonconcurred, and on a reconsideration of the said last amendment the First Branch concurred thereupon.

The ordinance for the inspection of flour was received from the Second Branch passed with amendments, which amendments being read were agreed to by the First Branch.

The bill entitled an ordinance regulating the sale of lime in the City of Baltimore was read a first and by special order a second time and passed with proposed amendments.

On motion therefor the Branch adjourned until tomorrow afternoon at three o'clock.
