by a resolution made a report stating that
in their opinion Mr. John Hargrove is entitled
to receive our hundred dollars for transcribing
bills passed at the present Session of the City
Council which resolution was read.

The joint Committee appointed for that
purpose reported that in their opinion and in
that of the Mayor with whom they had consulted
it is inexpedient to commence the building of a
City Hall, which report was read agreed to and
sent to the Second Branch and by them returned
agreed to.

A resolution was read agreed to sent
to the Second Branch and by them returned
agreed to for appropriating two hundred
dollars to be expended by the City Commis-
sioners in placing stepping or flag stones in
Baltimore Street at the junction of the second
cross Street from Harrison to Calvert Street in-

The report of the Committee on the
Lamp Petitions was returned by the Second
Branch agreed to.

The bill entitled an ordinance to repeal
as number of the ordinances of the Mayor and City
Council of Baltimore was received from the
Second Branch read a first and by special
order read a second time and passed and
thereupon was returned to the Second Branch.

A resolution was received from the

and for compensating the Register for abridging
the same which was read.
