City of Baltimore November 13<sup>th</sup> 1807 84

The Branch convened agreeably to a notification from the Mayor -

Present all the Members -

The Members were qualified and proceeded to elect a President, whereupon Mr. Baltus Schaeffer was elected -

The Branch proceeded to elect a Clerk and thereupon Stephen H. Moore was elected who appeared and qualified by taking the Oaths required by Law - Frederick Greary was chosen door keeper. The following message was received from the Second Branch

"In 2<sup>d</sup> Branch 13 Nov. 1807.

"Gentlemen of the 1<sup>st</sup> Branch

We have formed a quorum and are ready to proceed to business. I have appointed Mr. Pringle to join such Committee as you may please to appoint to wait on the Mayor to receive any communication he may have to make. By order *E. J. Coale AK*

To which this branch transmitted the following answer  
Gentlemen of the 2<sup>d</sup> Branch

We have appointed Messrs Buchanan and Cooke to join the Gentlemen named by your branch to wait upon the Mayor and inform him that the City Council have formed a quorum and are ready to receive any communication he may have to make.
