A message was received from the Second branch stating their Concurrence in the resolution directing the Register to record the City ordinances & accounts in a book to be procured for that purpose, and that they had disagreed to the resolution appropriating Three hundred & fifty dollars as a compensation to the Elders, & Trustees of the German Evangelical Reformed Church for the use of the bells in time of fire -
