

17<sup>th</sup> A Resolution for the Appropriation of a sum not exceeding One hundred Dollars for paving with brick that part of the Centre Market Space lying between Baltimore Street, & the front of the market house was read & by special order read a second time, Concurred in, Sent to the 2<sup>d</sup> Branch & by them returned agreed to —

— The Bill entitled "a Supplement to the Ordinance entitled" an Ordinance to preserve the Navigation of the harbor &c was read a second time & on motion therefor leave given to withdraw the same

— A Resolution appropriating Seventy five dollars for Oiling, minding and regulating the Town Clock, was presented, read, Concurred in & sent to the second branch, who returned the same agreed to —

— The Joint Committee appointed on the subject of a City Lottery &c. report a Bill entitled "an Ordinance authorizing a lottery to raise a sum of money in aid of the City funds" which bill was read the first & by special order a second time, passed & sent to the 2<sup>d</sup> Branch —

— The Bill entitled "An Ordinance to impose a tax on the real & personal property &c" was received from the second branch passed with a proposed amendment, which amendment being read was Concurred in & second branch informed thereof —

— A Bill entitled "An Ordinance to suspend so much of the Ordinance to preserve the health of the City &c was received from the 2<sup>d</sup> Branch, read the first & by special order a second time & negatived

20 Bill entitled "An Ordinance to suspend so much of the Ordinance to preserve the health of the City of Baltimore and for the due performance of quarantine at the Port of Baltimore as is therein mentioned." was submitted <sup>17<sup>th</sup> 6</sup> read the first & by special order a second time, <sup>passed</sup> ~~Concurred~~ in & sent to the second Branch —

On motion therefor the Branch adjourned until Tomorrow 3 o'clock P.M.

— The Bill entitled "an Ordinance suspending the quarantine Law &c" was received from the second branch, passed with amendments which amendments were read, and disagreed to, a Message was thereupon transmitted to the second Branch informing them of the said disagreement, & proposing that a Committee of Conference be appointed on the subject of said Bill, and stating the nomination of Mr Small, Mr Lorman & Mr Tenant on the part of this branch, to which the second Branch assented — The Committee of Conference having retired, returned and reported their disagreement, which report was non concurred in, The yeas and nays being demanded on the question
