Street" which was read, & by Special Order read a

returned passed -

The Bill entitled "An Ordinance to impose a tax  
on the real & personal property, within the City  
of Baltimore &c." was returned by the 2<sup>d</sup> Branch  
passed with proposed amendments, which amendments  
having been read were disagreed to & the Second Branch  
informed thereof who receded therefrom -

A Resolution for the appropriation of Sixty dollars,  
to remove nuisance in Cutaw Street at the intersection  
of Camden Street, was received from the 2<sup>d</sup> Branch  
and read -

The resolution appropriating fifteen dollars, to defray  
the expenses incurred by a recent election in the  
fourth ward was returned by the 2<sup>d</sup> Branch  
concurring in -

A Bill entitled "A Supplement to an Ordinance  
entitled "An Ordinance to appoint City Commissioners,  
& prescribing their duties" was received from the 2<sup>d</sup>  
Branch, read a first & by Special Order a second  
& third time and Negatives -

A Bill entitled "A Supplement to the Ordinance  
entitled an Ordinance to preserve the health of  
the City of Baltimore and for the due performance  
of quarantine" was received from the 2<sup>d</sup> Branch  
/read/

A Resolution appropriating Two hundred dollars for  
filling up Forrest Street to the South of Lee Street  
was received from the 2<sup>d</sup> Branch and read -

A petition from Frederick Lummalk was presented  
read, & ordered to lie on the table -

A Bill entitled "A Supplement to the Ordinance  
entitled "An Ordinance to prevent nuisances  
and to enforce useful regulations within  
the City of Baltimore" was received from the  
2<sup>d</sup> Branch, read, & by Special Order read a  
Second time & Negatives -

The Bill entitled "An Ordinance granting  
permissions to Christopher Hughes to extend his  
grounds on the South side of the basin" was  
returned by the Second Branch passed with amendments,  
which were concurred in by this branch & Second  
Branch informed thereof -
