The Bill entitled "an Ordinance authorizing  
 Thomas Tenant Baptist Mezick, Archibald Kerr  
 William Jackson, & James Bordenay to extend their  
 several wharves in the eighth ward" was read  
 a second time & ordered to lie on the table

The Resolution appropriating fifteen hundred dollars  
 for filling up McElderry's Street was read a second  
 time & nonconcurrent in. The yeas and nays being

an amendment to the said resolution was then proposed  
 substituting the sum of thirteen hundred dollars in  
 lieu of fifteen hundred dollars which was concurred  
 in, and the resolution thus amended returned to the  
 Second Branch who also concurred therein.

The Joint Committee to whom was referred the petition  
 of John Coulter and others reported a resolution  
 appropriating two thousand dollars for erecting  
 a fish market house & repairing the old market  
 house in the eighth ward which was read &  
 nonconcurrent in.

A Resolution was received from the 2<sup>d</sup> Branch  
 appropriating two hundred dollars for the purpose  
 of erecting a bridge across a Gully on Market  
 Street in the seventh ward which was read  
 concurred in & returned.

A Resolution was received from the 2<sup>d</sup> Branch  
 appropriating three hundred dollars in cutting  
 down & removing the hill at the North end  
 of Market Street in the 7<sup>th</sup> ward, which was  
 read concurred in with a proposed amendment  
 substituting two instead of three hundred dollars  
 for that purpose, and returned to the second  
 branch, who concurred in the said amendment.

A Resolution appropriating a sum of money  
 for repairing a bridge on Hartford Street at  
 the intersection of King George Street was submitted  
 read & referred to Messrs Tenant, Emis & Fry.

A Resolution was received from the second branch  
 appropriating a sum of money not exceeding  
 five hundred dollars in removing the stone  
 bridge on Wilkes Street in filling up the Gully  
 & conveying the water into the basin, which was  
 read & referred to Messrs Buchanan & Gray.
