On Motion to reconsider the report of the Committee to whom was referred the memorial of William B Gouldsmith & George Reinecker, the branch disagreed thereto

Leave having been granted for that purpose a Bill entitled "An Additional Supplement to the Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance more effectually to diminish the number of dogs in the City of Baltimore" was submitted & read the first time

A Message was transmitted to the second branch proposing to adjourn / when the Council should adjourn / until Tuesday the sixth inst. to which proposal the said Branch agreed

A petition was received from the City Collector praying for an extension of time to complete his collections was read & referred to Mr Carey & Mr Mummy who thereupon reported a Bill entitled "An Ordinance extending the time for the City Collector to complete his collections" which was read & by special order read a second time passed & sent to the 2<sup>d</sup> Branch
