The Committee to whom was referred the petition of John March praying for an appropriation of four hundred and eighty six dollars & thirty six cents to balance due him for paving York and Qulany Streets, made a report stating that the prayer of the petition ought to be granted, which report was read & ordered to lie on the table

The following resolution was received from the second branch which was read concurred in and returned.

Resolved that the Mayor be requested to cause an examination and accurate measurement to be made of all wharves, which he may have reason to believe do extend beyond the limits prescribed by the proper authorities, and report the same to the next session of the City Council: the expense whereof to be paid out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury.

Both branches of the City Council having again assembled in the Council Chamber of the first branch proceeded to the nomination of two persons to the Mayor to fill the office of Measurer and Inspector of Mahogany &c when it appeared that

A petition from Thomas Tenant praying for the removal of a pump & sinking well in George Street, was presented read and referred to Messrs Lynde, Sheppard & Camp.

The Bill entitled "An Ordinance to extend the time to the City Collector to complete his collections" was returned by the second branch passed.

A Message was received from the second branch proposing to refer a petition from J. Jones, A. Young & others to a joint Committee & stating the nomination of Messrs Biays and Payson as a committee on their part to which proposal the branch assented, appointed Messrs Buchanan Ross & Dickenhopper as a committee on their part & informing the 2^d branch thereof.
