The Joint Committee to whom was referred the application of R. Moor & others respecting a stream of water that flows down a Gully in the direction of Washington Street & the Memorial of D. McMechen respecting the same report, that they have had the said application and remonstrance under their serious consideration and from the difficulties that present themselves to the complying with the prayer of the applicants in consequence of the non condemnation of the property adjoining and the injury whether real or imaginary that is apprehended by the Opponents to the measure prayed for, do recommend that the petitioners have leave to withdraw their petition, and that the sum of two hundred dollars be appropriated to repair the bridge in Wick Street in the seventh ward, all which is submitted -

The Bill entitled "an Ordinance authorizing the erection of a temporary foot bridge over Jones' Falls from the fish Market" was read a second time, passed & returned to the 2<sup>d</sup> Branch.
