appointed to examine the same, be published  
for the information of the Citizens generally,  
in which proposal the second branch concurred.

A Resolution appropriating the sum of five  
dollars and ninety two Cents to pay Andrew  
Gerrin a balance due for building a public  
wharf on Camden Street was submitted  
and concurred in, & sent to the second  
branch & by them concurred in & returned.

The Committee on the subject of Idle and  
wandering poor, made the following report  
which was read and ordered to lie on  
the table. The Committee to whom was referred  
that part of the Mayor's communication  
relating to Idle and disorderly poor, beg  
leave to report the following resolution.

By the first branch of the City Council  
Resolved that the Mayor be and he is  
hereby required to prepare and present in  
the name of this Corporation a respectful  
memorial to the next General Assembly of  
Maryland praying them to enact some  
provision by Law for the relief of the Citizens  
of Baltimore from the many evils and great

impositions they annually suffer by the great  
number of vagrants and poor people who come  
to Baltimore every fall and winter from other  
Counties of this State, and also from other  
States of the Union.

A Petition from Samuel Smith and others  
praying that the Council would prescribe a mode  
of fixing the lines of Jones' Alley, was presented  
read and referred to Messrs. Kell, Ross and  
Difenderfer.

A petition from Philip R. J. Friese praying for  
permission to wharf out and extend his ground  
on the south side of the basin into the water  
to the north side of Lee Street of the width  
of two hundred and sixteen feet, was  
presented, read and referred to the con-  
sideration of the second branch.

On motion therefor the branch adjourned  
until To morrow 3 O'Clock P.M.
