

The ²⁸ Bill entitled "An Ordinance to impose a tax on the real and personal property within the City of Baltimore and to provide for the Collection of the same for the year 1811." was read a second & third time and passed

A Resolution appropriating a sum not exceeding one hundred Dollars for placing posts or stones in such situations as shall best secure the pillars supporting the wings of the Centre Market house from injury by carts or Waggon running against them was submitted, read & concurred in & sent to the second branch

A petition from Samuel Reimitt praying that an additional number of Inspectors of Salted fish may be appointed was presented, read & referred to Messrs. Hill, Lamm & Sheppard

A petition from Calvin Cooper & others Owners of Slays & Sleighs praying to be relieved from the tax on Sleighs was presented, read and referred to Messrs. Diefendaffer & Wilson

A petition from George Warner & others praying for an appropriation to improve the condition of John Street & Eutan Street Courts adjacent was presented, read & referred to Messrs. Lewis Berry & Torrey.

The Resolution transmitted to the second Branch appropriating one hundred & twenty Dollars for the purpose of laying flag stones between the upper & lower Centre Market house
