- further consideration thereof in as much as the alleged claim has been provided for by a Resolution passed in March last. In which report the branch concurred.

The Committee to whom was referred the petition of the Mechanics fire company made a report that in their opinion the prayer of the petitioners ought not to be granted, which being read was concurred in & our Motion to reconsider the same, was again read and concurred in.

The Committee on the petition of George Warner and others reported a resolution appropriating one hundred dollars for the purpose of digging two gutters or ditches, one on each side of John Street & laying a culvert or trunk across said street in the first ward which being read was concurred in and sent to the second branch.

A Resolution directing the Committee to whom was recommended the resolution appropriating three thousand dollars, to erect a culvert in Harbor Street, to have a survey and plat of said Street & of the streets crossing the same, to be made, and an estimate of the probable expense that may arise in placing a culvert therein, or other mode of improving said Street & those crossing the same from Dulaney Street to Wilky Street, the expense of which plat & survey to be paid out of

the contingent fund, was submitted, read and concurred in. 33

The Resolution appropriating the sum of thirteen hundred dollars to repair South Liberty Street was read a second time, concurred in and returned to the second branch.

A Bill entitled "A Supplement to the Ordinance entitled an Ordinance for the safe keeping of Gun Powder within the City of Baltimore and the precincts thereof." was received from the second branch, and read the first time.
