To the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore
The Visitor, of the City
Hospital appointed during the last Session
of the City Council beg leave to report,

That in Pursuance of their Appointment
they have performed the duty assigned them
and find that Doctor, McKenzie & Smyth
have erected at the East end of that part
of said Hospital heretofore built by the
Corporation a square or Centre building
68 feet long by 61 feet deep, four stories
high, which they have connected to the old
part heretofore built by a wing building
56 feet long and thirty eight feet deep
three stories high, which two buildings
added to the old part as above mentioned
cover a space of 216 feet in length, the
parts lately erected, are in a state of forward-
ness, that justifies the opinion, that the
whole may be completed during the present
year, the old part of the building has been
repaired, that patients can now be received
and well accommodated, there are also a
number of cells finished for the reception
of maniacs in the parts lately erected.
