The Branch met agreeably to adjournment.
Present Adam Toner and President & all the
other Members.

The Committee to whom was referred the
Bill from the Second Branch entitled
"An Supplement to an Ordinance to provide
for the erecting a Stone Bridge over Jones's
Falls at the crossing of Gay Street" made
a report recommending the said Bridge to be
built with one Arch, which report was
read & ordered to lie on the Table.

The Committee to whom was referred the petition
of Salmon Morton Administrator of George
Walter, made a report that the prayer of
the petition was reasonable & ought to be
granted, which was read & concurred in.

The resolution submitted by the Committee to
whom was referred the petition of Hezekiah
Clagett & others, Appropriating the sum of
Twenty nine hundred and nine Dollars to
be expended in repaving North Liberty Street
was read a second time and concurred in.

On the question of adopting the said
resolution the ayes and Nays being demanded
were as follows -

who returned the same Concurred in with proposed
Amendments, requiring the expediture to be made
with the Approbation of the Mayor, and the
Assent to be obtained of all persons owning
Property on said Street, before the alteration
of the grade thereof, which amendments were
read and Concurred in, & the Second Branch
informed thereof.

A Communication from the City Commissioners
relating to the petition of Messrs. Eliza & George
Bayley praying for reimbursement of Cades
sustained by them in consequence of their
contracts for paving Holliday & McElderry
Streets; was received, read & referred to the
Committee heretofore Appointed on the subject
of said petition.

A Resolution Appropriating the sum of Six
Hundred Dollars to be paid to the Chief
Justice of the Court of Oyer and Terminer
and Goal delivery for Baltimore County
for his extra services the ensuing year, in
the execution of the Act of Assembly entitled
"An Act relating to Vagrants in the City of
Baltimore" was received from the Second
Branch, and read the first time.

A Bill entitled "An Ordinance more effectually
to prevent Swine running at large in the
City of Baltimore" was received from the
Second Branch & read the first time.
