

The ¹⁶⁹ Bill entitled 'An Ordinance for Making a correct Survey of the City of Baltimore' was read a second and third time, passed with proposed amendments, and returned to the Second Branch, who acceded to the said Amendments.

The Resolution authorizing the Presidents of the first and Second Branches of the City Council with the approbation of the Mayor to contract with W^m Gwyn Esq. for the purchase of a lot of ground fronting on Calvert and Chatham Streets for the purpose of erecting thereon at a future time a City Hall and Watch house for the use of the Corporation, was read a second time and amended so as to read thus

- 1 Resolved that the Presidents of the
- 2 first and Second Branches of the City
- 3 Council with the approbation of the
- 4 Mayor be and they are hereby authorized
- 5 to contract for the purchase of a suitable
- 6 lot of ground for the purpose of erecting thereon at a future time a City Hall & Watch house for the use of the Corporation & to pay for the same out of any unappropriated Money in the Treasury a sum not exceeding Ten thousand Dollars.

A motion was made to postpone the further consideration thereof to the 6th day of June next, and negatived, a motion was also made to amend the same by

inserting in the 6th line of said amended Resolution between the words "ground & for" "to the eastward of Calvert Street" also negatived, it was then moved to insert in the same place the words "to the Eastward of South Street" which motion was declared by the President to be not in order, It was then moved to reconsider the said resolution, which motion was also negatived and the resolution being again read, was ordered to lie on the Table until tomorrow.

The Bill entitled "An Ordinance more effectually to prevent huckstering in the General Markets within the City of Baltimore" was returned by the Second Branch endorsed "will not pass"

The Committee to whom was referred the Resolution from the Second Branch appropriating a sum of money not exceeding Five hundred dollars to be expended in taking up and repaving that part of Frederick Street which lies between Second and Water Streets & altering the grade thereof, made a report that they had viewed the premises, and were of opinion that the resolution ought to be concurred in, which resolution being read the second time was agreed to and returned to the Second Branch.

A Bill entitled "A Supplement to the Ordinance for the regulation of the General Markets within the City of Baltimore" was received from the Second Branch & read the first time
