The City Council having been specially convened by the Mayor the first Branch met at their Chamber in South Street. Present all the members except Messrs. Berry, Mosher, Fonerden, Stenard & Synson. The requisite number of members to form a quorum not being present, the Branch adjourned until To-morrow 3 o'clock P.M.

A message was sent to the second Branch informing them that the first Branch had formed a quorum, and had appointed Messrs. Mosher & Stenard to join such members as they might nominate to wait upon the Mayor and inform him that the Council was in session and ready to receive such communication as he might please to make, to which the second Branch assented and nominated Mr. McDonald as a committee on their part for the purpose aforesaid.
