A communication was received from the Mayor
furnishing agreeably to Resolution of the 19th Instant
a List or Statement of Debts due from the City,
which require to be paid during the present year.
Also one other communication on the subject of
suit depending in the High Court of Chancery
of the State of Maryland, between the Corporation
of the City of Baltimore and Mr. Isaac M^r.
with two inclosures. One a Letter from Samuel
Chase Esq^r the attorney in the case, the other
Legal opinion given on the subject by the
Hon^{ble} Jeremiah Chase; which being read
were decided to lie on the table.

The Committee to whom was referred the Con-
sideration of the improvement of Hannover Street
House, presented a Resolution recommending
the appropriation of Eleven hundred Dollars
for that object, which being read a first
and second time was concurred in, and ordered
to be sent to the second Branch.

The Report of the Committee relating to the
improvement of Harford Street was read a
second time, and concurred in, and the
yeas and nays being required appeared
as follows.

Stewart & Fulton to prepare a Bill in pursuance
of the said Report. Which Committee presented
a Bill Entitled "An Ordinance for the permanent
Improvement of Harford Street" which being read a
first time was ordered to lie on the table.

A message was received from the second Branch
proposing an adjournment until Tuesday afternoon
next at 3 O'clk which proposal was
accorded to by this Branch, & adjourned accordingly.
