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One on Wall, between George and Pitt streets

One at the Corner of Wilkes Street & Starnall

One at the Corner of Wilkes & Washington Streets

One at the Corner of Fleck and Washington streets, and two in Fountain Street". -

Which was read a First time & ordered to lie on the table.

The Resolution directing the City Commissioners to establish the lines between the City & Precinct, & also the Resolution appropriating the sum of Fifty Dollars for the purpose of filling up part of Caroline Street, near Dulaney Street, were returned from the Second Branch enclosed "Concurred in"

The Bill entitled "An Ordinance relating to the City Commissioners and Commissioners of Health" was on motion read a second time and committed to a Committee composed of Messrs. Hill, Sherman, Cary and Stenard, to consider and report thereon.

A Resolution from the Second Branch authorizing "the sum of Five hundred dollars to be added to the general appropriation Bill for the present year, to be at the disposal of the Mayor for the purpose of rewarding those who are active in detecting and bringing to punishment the violators of

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the Law" was received and read a first time and by Special Order a second time & concurred in.

A Bill entitled "A Supplement to the Ordinance to preserve the Harbour of Baltimore, and to provide for the exercise of the powers vested in the Port Wardens by Act of Assembly" was received from the Second Branch and by Order read a first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A Message was received from the Second Branch proposing "that when the City Council adjourn tomorrow it adjourn until the twelfth day of April next, for the purpose of giving time to the City Collector to furnish the statement required of him, and of completing the nomination of City officers" to which an answer was prepared but before the same was sent in that Branch had adjourned.

The Committee to whom was referred the subject of a more equal division of the Wards, made the following report.

"An Ordinance for the more equal division of the City of Baltimore into Wards". Which being read a first time was ordered to lie on the table.
