for extending the Foot-ways in the City of
Baltimore, to be drawn for and expended in
like manner as the former appropriation for
the same object". Which being Read the
First and by special Order a second time
concurred in and sent to the second Branch
who returned the same endorsed "Concurred".

A Resolution making appropriation for
reducing Washington square to the level of
the established grade of Calvert and East
streets, was received from the second Branch
and Read the first and by special Order a
second time and concurred in.

The Committee to whom was referred the
Petition of Elisha Randall made their
Report as follows: "That as a Law has
been passed by this City Council in their
present session, prohibiting all public
watering places within the limits of the
City, they are therefore of opinion that
the prayer of the Petitioner, ought not
to be granted". Which being Read was
concurred in.

The Bill entitled "An Ordinance for the

Inspection of Lime" was on motion submitted
Read a first and by special Order the second
time, passed and transmitted to the second Branch
who returned the same endorsed "Will not pass".

A Message was sent to the second Branch pro-
posing with their concurrence to go immediately
into the nomination of City officers to the Mayor
and inviting their attendance in the Chamber
of the First Branch for that purpose; and also
proposing that when the Council shall adjourn
their present sitting that they adjourn until
the twenty first day of May next.

In answer to which a message was received
from the second Branch agreeing to the proposi-
tions contained in our message & accepting the
invitation to attend in the Chamber of the First
Branch for the purpose of continuing the
nomination of City officers to the Mayor.

Both Branches having convened the Council
proceeded by joint Ballot to nominate City
officers to the Mayor, when it appeared
the following persons had the greatest
number of Votes, agreeably to the Order in
which they are respectively named and were
directed to be so returned to the Mayor.
