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add "Provided the same shall not be used for any other purpose than a cover or shed for a saw-mill, and provided also that the same shall be removed or rebuilt in such manner as is now required by ordinance, whenever in the opinion of the Mayor and City Council, it shall be necessary to do so" — Which amendment was read, concurred in, and the 2^d Branch informed thereof by message

A Resolution granting the assent of the Mayor & City Council, to draw a lottery or lotteries by the trustees of the Baltimore College for the benefit of that institution was received from the 2^d Branch, read a first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion therefor, the Branch adjourned until Monday, 3 O'clock in the afternoon.

Monday February 21st 1814.

The Branch met agreeably to adjournment, present James Barry Esquire President & all the other members.

A message was sent to the second Branch informing them this Branch had formed a Quorum, and were prepared to go into the nomination of a City Collector, and inviting their attendance in the Chamber of the First Branch for that purpose.

Both Branches having accordingly assembled together, proceeded by joint ballot to the said nomination when it appearing that Thomas Rogers and John

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Miller Junior had the greatest number of votes, agreeably to the order in which they are respectively named, were directed to be so returned to the Mayor.

The second Branch having retired to their chamber, The Resolution from the 2^d Branch, granting the assent of the City Council for the Trustees of Baltimore College to raise by scheme of a lottery or lotteries such sum or sums of money, and for such purpose or purposes as they are authorized by Act of Assembly to do, was on motion read a second time, concurred in, and returned to the 2^d Branch.

A Message was received from the 2^d Branch, stating that "tomorrow being the birth day of General Washington and it being expected that the Citizens of Baltimore would generally be engaged in Military exercise" they proposed that when the Council adjourn, they adjourn until Wednesday afternoon 3 O'clock" Which being agreed to, this Branch, on motion therefor adjourn to the day and hour before mentioned.
