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This Balance will probably be sufficient for paving
Cross streets for the present year; there being already
several streets applied for to be paved & others may offer.

Also for repairing & repaving paved streets Lanes
and Alleys an appropriation will be necessary, say. \$1500.

To be expended in the following manner Viz:

For Repaving German Lane, suspended last
year say. \$220.

For Repaving Granby Street from Little
York Street to Wilkes St., which cannot
well be repaired, unless wholly taken up } 350.

For lowering & repaving a part of Barr
Street, to meet the present pavement } 120.
in Howard Street.

There is a Balance due to E. T. Bayly for
the alterations done in Charles Street, last
year, the appropriation not being sufficient } 58.95
to complete the same. Balance 738.40

The Balance it is presumed will be sufficient for the
necessary General Repairs.

A Petition from Howell Powell & others, praying that
may be erected on Potter Street, between Pitt Street and
Necessity Alley. was prepared read and referred to the
Lamp Committee, composed of Messrs. Wilson & Limmer to
consider and report thereon.

The following Report of the Visitors of the City Hospital
was received from the Mayor. Viz:

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"To the Mayor & City Council of Baltimore.

The visitors of the City Hospital appointed at the last session
to the City Council beg leave to Report, that in pursuance of their
appointment and the performance of the duties assigned them, they
have the satisfaction to state, that the additional buildings, erected
by Doctor McKim, & mentioned in a former report, to be
in a state of forwardness, consisting of a wing building 56 feet
long and 38 feet deep, three stories high, connected to the old
part heretofore built; and a square or Centre building, at
the east end 68 feet long by 61 feet deep, four stories high,
covering in the whole a space of 216 feet in length, are now
nearly completed.

The Centre building contains a number of spacious rooms
the other part besides several large rooms, a number of cells
for the reception of Maniacs; so that patients of any description
can now be received and well accommodated.

In addition to the aforesaid buildings, a substantial brick
wall, neatly topped with stone, with handsome gates, has been
erected, inclosing the whole, including a large yard; This
wall extends 400 feet in length by 200 feet in depth, embracing
an extent of 1200 feet.

On the north front of the Hospital and opposite to the
Centre building, is an elegant iron railing 68 feet in length
and one of similar extent on the south front, of plain
workmanship.

There have been likewise erected stables and carriage
house, a large dairy, Bakehouse, Lodges for the Gatekeepers,
Corporal-house and other necessary out houses; A Spring of
excellent water has also been found, on the lot, and
arched over with brick.
