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Jenkins appointed a Committee on the part of this Branch to join that nominated by the second Branch, and a message returned informing them thereof.

A Memorial was presented from Messrs Robert G. McKim, complaining of inconvenience experienced by the overflowing of the Canal or ditch, which passes through Powers' Lot, and praying that the same may be immediately attended to by the Mayor & City Council. Which being read was referred to Messrs Wilson & Jamison to consider and report thereon.

A Bill entitled "A further supplement to the Ordinance regulating the Cording of Fire Wood, brought by water to the City of Baltimore for sale" was read a first time, and on order the second time, passed and sent to the 2^d Branch.

A Petition from William Camp & others owners and occupants of property situate on Concord Street in the City of Baltimore, setting forth that their property is seriously injured by erecting Pratt Street Bridge and raising the street adjacent thereto, and praying "exemption from the expense of raising & repaving said street," was read, and on motion referred to Messrs Plummer, Dyer and Fry to consider and report thereon.

A Petition from Gilbert Middleton, Inspector of Beef and Pork in the City of Baltimore, praying to be exempted from paying licence to the Corporation, was presented, and on leave given therefor the following Bill was submitted and read, to wit:

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"A Supplement to the Ordinance entitled An Ordinance for the Inspection of Beef and Pork in the City of Baltimore."

Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore that the inspector of Beef and Pork, shall pay for the licence he is required to obtain from the Mayor the sum of Fifty Dollars for the year ending in May next, and that the same sum for each and every year thereafter; any thing in the Ordinance to which this is a supplement to the contrary notwithstanding. Which was by special order read a second time, passed and sent to the 2^d Branch, who returned the same ordered "to lie on the table."

A Petition from Enoch Potts & others securities of Benjamin Fowler, City Collector for the year 1813, stating "that there is considerable sum yet due, and praying one of their number may be appointed to collect the same, and that Enoch Potts be a person for said purpose; and praying also an extension of time to enable him to complete said collection" was presented & read, and an motion referred to a Committee composed of Messrs Jamison, Warner and Sheppard to consider and report thereon.

The Committee to whom was referred the petition of Christy Chapman & others, relative to building a Bridge over Bayard Street Run, at the intersection of Queen St. made a Report which not being concurred in, the subject of said petition was recommended to the consideration of Messrs Warner, Potts & Perry; it not being in the power of Mr. Mosher to attend.
