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The Committee appointed on the petition of Mr. Wilson Camp and others beg leave to report. That they have made the necessary inquiry, and on examination find that the supposed nuisance which caused the re-paving of Concord Street, originated in the alteration of the grade in

Your Committee not being able to obtain vouchers to show that the proprietors holding property on Concord Street had given their assent to re-pave said street at their expense, but it appearing on the contrary that the said proprietors conceived themselves much injured by their property being thrown so much below the former level of the street which appears very evident to your Committee.

Your Committee are therefore of opinion that the prayer of the petitioners ought to be granted.
