A Petition from George Bandell & others, "holding and owning Houses on Bond Street and Strawberry Alley in the seventh ward", praying Lamps may be erected in Strawberry Alley, between Gough & Mills Streets, was presented, read and referred to the Lamp Committee.

On motion, the petition of William Camp & others, praying to be exempt from payment of the expense incurred by filling up and repairing Concord Street; and also the subject of George W. Bayly's petition, was recommended to the former Committee appointed thereon, with the addition of Messrs Wilson, Ross and Taylor added thereto, for the purpose of reconsidering and reporting on the several subjects contained in said petitions.

A message was sent to the second Branch, proposing with the concurrence, that when the City Council do adjourn, they adjourn until Monday the fourteenth instant, 3 o'clock in the afternoon, which was agreed to by the 2^d Branch by message.

A Resolution was received from the second Branch, authorizing the sum of Fifty Dollars to be added to the Appropriation of the present year, for the purpose of compensating Samuel Young for making Copies of the survey of the Cove, east of Jones's Falls. - Which being read a first and a second time, a special Order the second time was concurred in.

A Petition from Sheppard & McCordy and others, praying that a Lamp may be erected at the intersection of Pratt Street and Spear Wharf, was presented and read; And on motion therefor it was resolved that the Lamp Committee be requested and directed to provide for the Lamp prayed for, in their general Report.

A Petition from Zachariah Urie & others, praying two Lamps may be erected on Patterson Street, was presented, read and referred to the Lamp Committee.

The Committee to whom was referred the petition of Wm. Camp and others; And also of that of George W. Bayly, made the following Report.
