The Resolution "exempting the Inspector of Butcher, Lard and Flaxseed from the payment of License for the ensuing year," was on motion read the second time concurred in and sent to the second Branch for their concurrence, who returned the same endorsed "concurrent in".

The Committee to whom was recommended the petition of Michael Mather & others, submitted the following Report: "The Committee to whom was referred the petition of Michael Mather and others have had the same under consideration, and from every information that can be obtained thereon are of the opinion from the existing laws regulating streets and pumps, that the prayer of the petition ought not to be granted." A Bill entitled "An Ordinance for the Inspection & Measure of Lard" was received from the second Branch, read a first and by special order the second time, passed and returned to the second Branch.

The Resolution directing the Mayor to pay George W. Bayly the amount of his account for repaving Concord Street, was returned from the second Branch endorsed - "In 2nd Branch March 14th 1844 read the first time & ordered to lie on the table" - March 15th 1844 read the second time and concurred in. A Bill entitled "A Supplement to the Ordinance entitled 'An Ordinance providing for the appointment of Wardens of the Ports of Baltimore and for other purposes'." was submitted, read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.
