Was presented, read, & ordered to be referred to Messrs Mosher & Jenkins to consider & report therefor referred to Messrs Mosher & Jenkins to consider & report therefor.

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The Committee to whom was referred the consideration of the petition of Jeremiah & J. Sullivan, agents of Ely Denny, made their report as follows.

"The Committee to whom was referred the petition of Jeremiah & Sullivan, have had the same under consideration, and report, that they are not entitled to relief, and that the petitioners have leave to withdraw their petition. Signed, Tho Shippard, Talbot Jones." Which being read a first & by special order the second time was concurred in.
