A Bill entitled an Ordinance to repeal "An Ordinance herein mentioned" was on motion submitted, read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A Resolution relative to illuminating the City to commemorate the happy restoration of peace, was submitted read & ordered to lie on the table.

On motion therefor the Branch adjourned until tomorrow at noon 3 o'clock.
