"Your Committee on the Petition of Elias Ellis and others in relation to the powers of the Wardens of the Port of Baltimore and to build a mud machine beg leave to Report by an additional supplement to the Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance providing for the appointment of Wardens of the Port of Baltimore, and for other purposes"

1st Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, that the Wardens of the Port of Baltimore be and they are hereby invested with the most full and ample power and authority to carry into strict execution all laws and Ordinances of this Corporation having relation to the deepening, cleaning and preserving from unwaranted encroachments, the Basin and Harbour of Baltimore

2^d And be it enacted and ordained, that the sum of Five thousand dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated for the purpose of building an additional Mud Machine; and the Wardens of the Port of Baltimore or a majority of them are hereby authorized to draw on the Register from time to time for the same, or so much thereof as may be necessary

Which Report and Bill having been read a first

by special order the second time was concurred in & sent to the second Branch for their concurrence, who returned the same endorsed "will pass".

The following Resolution was on motion submitted and read a first and by special order the second time and concurred in, to wit:

Resolved by both Branches of the City Council that the Mayor be and he is hereby requested to employ Council to attend to the suit instituted by Cumberland Dugan and the heirs of Thomas McEldery in the Chancery Court, against the Corporation of the City of Baltimore, for the purpose of bringing the same to a speedy conclusion"

Which being sent to the second Branch for their concurrence returned the same endorsed "Assented to with the proposed amendment" - the amendment proposed "at the end of the Resolution add, "for the purpose of bringing the same to a speedy conclusion" which amendment was agreed to by the First Branch and the 2^d Br. advised thereof by message.
