Which being read was ordered to lie on the table.

The Bill which originated in this Branch, entitled "A Supplement to the Ordinance for <sup>the</sup> regulation of the several Markets within the City of Baltimore" was returned from the second Branch, endorsed "Will not pass" - And accompanying said Bill, was received a Bill which originated in the second Branch, bearing precisely the same title, but differing in some respects with the one rejected - which having been read, was on motion therefor, referred to the Committee heretofore appointed to "examine the laws respecting Hysterity, for the purpose of reexamining and reporting thereon".

A Bill entitled "An Ordinance to prevent Goats going at large within the City of Baltimore" was on motion submitted, read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion therefor the Resolution relative to a permanent fund for the relief of the Citizens wounded at Bladensburg, or in defence of the City of Baltimore" was read a second time, concurred in and Mess<sup>rs</sup>. Jamison Magruder & Berry, <sup>appointed a Committee</sup> to consider & report thereon.

On motion therefor, the Branch adjourned until 3 o'clock tomorrow afternoon.

The Bill entitled "An Ordinance to prevent Goats going at large within the City of Baltimore" was on motion called up, read a second time, passed and sent to the second Branch for their concurrence.

A Petition from Isaac M<sup>r</sup> Pherson & Nelson Norris praying a second inspector of Lime may be appointed for the convenience of the inhabitants of the Western part of the City, was presented, read and referred to Mess<sup>rs</sup>. Wilson of John, Brevill & Russell to consider and report thereon.

The Bill entitled "A Supplement to An Ordinance entitled An Ordinance for the regulation of the several markets within the City of Baltimore" was on motion read the second time, passed & returned to the 2<sup>d</sup> Branch.

The Communication from John Hargrove Esquire, on the subject of an increase of Salary, was on motion read a second time, and the consideration thereof referred to Mess<sup>rs</sup>. Reese, Robt, Woelker, Warner and Berry, to report thereon.

A Petition from Michael Gaub, Inspector of Dry & Long measures praying some additional Allowance <sup>may be</sup> made to his present perquisites of Office, was presented read & referred to the Committee above mentioned, for augmentation of City Officers Salaries.

The Committee to whom was referred the Petition of Naberry Park, and Robert Parker, made their Report by submitting a Bill entitled "A further additional supplement to the Ordinance entitled An Ordinance for the Inspection of Fish in the City of Baltimore". Which having been read the first time was ordered to lie on the table.
