A petition from Nathaniel C. Dare & others, praying a Lamp may be put up at the corner of Banover street and Welcome Alley in the second Ward, and from Monsieur DeBense & others on the same subject were severally presented, read and referred to the Lamp Committee.

The Committee to whom was referred the Petition of Isaac M. Pherson & Nelson Reid on the subject of a second Inspector and measurer of Lime made their report by submitting a Bill entitled "A Supplement to an Ordinance entitled An Ordinance regulating the inspection and measurement of Lime in the City of Baltimore" which being read the first time was ordered to lie on the table.

A Message was sent to the second Branch, proposing "that when the City Council does adjourn, that it adjourn until Wednesday next" which message was returned from the 2^d Branch endorsed "Read & disagreed to" ^{By Order of the City Council} and immediately thereafter a message was received from the second Branch proposing to adjourn until Monday next at 3 o'clock P. M. which proposal was agreed to and the second Branch informed thereof by message.

The Committee to whom was referred the petition of Isaac M. Pherson & Nelson Norris, made their report by submitting "A Bill, entitled A Supplement to the Ordinance for the inspection & measure of Lime" which being read the first time was ordered to lie on the table.

On motion therefor the Branch adjourned until Monday the 18th Instant at 3 o'clock P. M. By Order W. Bailey

The Branch met agreeably to adjournment, present William Patterson Esquire, president and all the other members, except M. Jamison.

The following Resolution was on motion submitted, read & ordered to lie on the table viz. "Resolved by both branches of the City Council of Baltimore that the Resolution prohibiting any members of the City Council from being candidates for any office under the Corporation, be and the same is hereby repealed".

A motion was made that the above Resolution have a second reading, which motion was superseded by leave given to withdraw the same for amendment.

The Bill entitled "A supplement to the Ordinance entitled an Ordinance for the inspection & measure of Lime in the City of Baltimore" was on motion read a second time, passed & sent to the second branch for their concurrence.

A petition from Joseph Turner junior and others, praying that Light street may be repaired between Camden & Barr streets, in such manner as to render the same "more passable, more cleanly and consequently more wholesome" was presented, read and referred to the Mayor & City Commissioners.

It was moved and seconded, that the Branch reconsider the vote heretofore taken on the rejected Resolution in favour of the Washington company - which motion was concurred in, the Resolution read the first & second time by special order, concurred in and sent to the second Branch for their concurrence.

The Bill entitled "An Ordinance more effectually to prevent the spreading of Fires in the City of Baltimore" was returned from the second Branch endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments" which having been read were agreed to and the second Branch informed thereof by message.

The Bill entitled "A further supplement to the Ordinance entitled An Ordinance to preserve the health of the City of Baltimore and for the due performance of Quarantine at the Port of Baltimore" was returned from the second branch endorsed "will not pass".
