The Committee to whom was referred the petition of Levi James and others made report by submitting "A Resolution appropriating the sum of fifty four dollars for the purpose of erecting three new Lamps in the seventh Ward" as by said Resolution directed; which having been the first & second time by special order was concurred in and sent to the second Branch for their concurrence.

The following Resolution was on motion submitted. Viz:  
 "Resolved by both branches of the City Council that the Captains of the watch and City Mesinger be appointed by the City Council in the same manner as the other officers of the Corporation are". which being read the first and by special order a second time was ordered to lie on the table.

A Message was received from the second Branch proposing with the concurrence of this Branch "that when the City Council adjourns this afternoon, it adjourn until Monday next 3 o'clock in the afternoon" which
