

The Bill entitled "A further additional Supplement to the Ordinance entitled 'An Ordinance to regulate the public Wharves, and for the Collection of certain Rates'" was on motion Read a second time, passed and Ordered to be sent to the 2^d Branch for their concurrence.

The Bill entitled "A further additional Supplement to an Ordinance entitled 'An Ordinance to prevent Nuisances and to enforce useful regulations within the City of Baltimore'" was returned from the second Branch, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments" to wit 1st Strike out the words "or wooden cornices at the roofs of any Houses" at the end of the first section. 2^d Strike out the word "Reasonably" in the last line but one of the 3^d section. Which amendment after debate had thereon, was concurred in by a majority of votes.

The Committee appointed on that part of the Mayor's Communication which relates to the extension of the City, made their Report by submitting a Bill entitled "An Ordinance to provide for the ascertaining and marking the limits of the City of Baltimore" which having been read the first time was ordered to lie on the table.

The following Resolution was on motion submitted, to wit: "Resolved by the first branch of the City Council of Baltimore, that Messrs Woodyear, Jamison and Sheppard be, and they are hereby constituted a Committee to enquire into the subject of the right of the City to Wharfage or Tonnage on the several Wharves erected by individuals on any street lane or alley in the City, and to Report thereon to this branch". Which having been Read

The Bill entitled A Supplement to an Ordinance to regulate the measuring and weighing of grain, flour and meal, in the City of Baltimore, and for other purposes therein mentioned was on motion Read a second time, ^{non concurred in} and ordered to be returned to the 2^d Branch.

The Committee appointed on the Petition of Henry Thompson & others relative to the extension of a Wharf in the 8th Ward, submitted the following Report. Viz

"The joint Committee to whom was referred the petition of Henry Thompson and others beg leave to report that they have examined the premises and are of opinion that they be permitted to extend a platform from the south end of their western boundary agreeably to the plot - but as respects their eastern extension the Committee recommend that the applicants have permission to extend it, provided they recede at least four feet westerly from the line between their property and that of Mr. James Biagg".

Accompanying said Report was a Bill predicated thereon entitled "An Ordinance authorizing Henry Thompson, Timothy Gardner and James Ramsay to extend their Wharf in the eighth ward". Which Report & Bill having been severally read the first time were ordered to lie on the table.

The Resolution relating to the improvement of Hanover Market was on motion Read a second time concurred in and ordered to be sent to the second branch for their concurrence.

The Committee to whom was referred the petition of James D. Jones & others on the subject of filling up a part of Eden Street, made their Report by submitting the following Resolution Viz

"Resolved by both branches of the City Council that the sum of sixty dollars be added to the Appropriation Bill for this year, to be expended under the direction of the City Commissioners, toward filling up Eden Street, near the intersection of German Street".

Which having been read the first time was ordered to lie on the table. When
