

214 The Commissioners receive a sufficient pledge from the proprietors that the said streets be forthwith paved.

Which amendment was agreed to by message.

The Bill intitled "An Ordinance to Repeal the Ordinance entitled An Ordinance Regulating the Sale of Cattle at the Centre Market and for other purposes" being called up to a second Reading, was moved, seconded & agreed to, that the consideration thereof be made the order of the day for Thursday next.

A Member from the seventh ward, after an explanatory address submitted several Resolutions for the improvement of Washington Street, preservation of the harbour &c, which having been severally read, it was moved, that previous to any further proceedings being had thereon, a Committee of three members be appointed, who in conjunction with the City Commissioners & Port Wardens (who were be requested to attend for the purpose) to take the subject into full & thorough consideration & examination and Report the result of their joint deliberations to this branch. Which motion or proposition was unanimously agreed to and Messrs Thppard, Mosher and Wilson appointed the Committee for the purpose.

A Petition from James Armstrong and others, Residing on Market Space, complaining of the present Cattle Market as a nuisance, and praying that the same may be removed was presented, read and ordered to lie on the table.

The joint Committee appointed for the purpose, submitted the following Report,

"The Report of the joint Committee to whom so much of the Mayor's Communication as relates to the act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the last session, providing for the extension of the City of Baltimore, may leave to Report, that after much consideration they have formed an opinion that it would be advisable to defer the passage of any other Ordinances on this subject until the limits of the City shall be ascertained and

215 marked, and a return thereof made as is provided by an existing Ordinance and as this can be effected in all probable time before the fourth Monday in May next, they recommend that the City Council after it has passed upon its other business, will adjourn until that day."

Which Report having been read was concurred in and sent to the second branch for their concurrence.

The Lamp Committee made Report by submitting the following Resolution - Viz:

"Resolved by both branches of the City Council of Baltimore, that the City Commissioners be, and they are hereby authorized & directed to fix a Lamp on the corner of John Goodings house at the lower end of Accommodation Alley, another on the West end of the Smoke house near the middle of the same alley, another on Campbell and Ritchies warehouse in Charles Street, another at the bridge at the intersection of German and Harford Streets, another at the intersection of German and Eden Streets, another at or near the pump in Eden Street, and another on the corner of Doctor Girards house in Eden Street near German street. Another in Conway Street on the upper corner of two new brick houses now building on the North side of said street, between Hanover and Charles Streets, Another in Wine Alley, between Light & Charles Streets, Another at the Corner of Forrest Street & Sugar Alley, Another at the Corner of Liberty Street and Necessity Alley, and two others in Commerce Street, south of Pratt Street, and that the expense thereof be paid out of any unappropriated money in the treasury." Which Resolution having been read the first time was ordered to lie on the table.
