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The word "Commissioners" in the second line, insert "in conjunction with Colonel Harris and James Mosher". Which proposed amendment having been read, was ordered to lie on the table.

A Memorial from Hezekiah Waters and others, proprietors of sundry Wharves on Fells Point, extending from the East side of Wood Street Eastwardly into the Basin, stating that their Wharves are likely to be filled up and ruined, in consequence of the large torrent of water which descends Washington Street, &c. and praying that an Ordinance may be passed for their relief. Was presented Read and referred to Messrs. Sheppard Mosher and Wilson to consider and Report thereon.

A Bill entitled "A further Additional Supplement to the Ordinance, entitled An Ordinance to Regulate the Quaging of Casks and the inspection of Spiritous liquors in the City of Baltimore" Was Received from the Second Branch, Read the first time and Ordered to lie on the table.

On motion the following Bills were submitted Viz.
A Bill entitled "An Ordinance for paving Wilkes Street, Washington Street, Castle Alley & County Street"
Also A Bill entitled "An Ordinance for paving part of Dulany Street, in the City of Baltimore".

Which Bills having been read the first, and by special Order a second time, Will pass.

The following Resolution was on motion submitted, Read the first and second time by Special Order, Concurred in and ordered to be sent to the second branch for their concurrence.

Viz. Resolved by both branches of the City Council, That the Wardens of the Port of Baltimore, be and they are hereby authorized and required (whenever they shall deem the same necessary) to cause abutments or piers to be constructed at the end of the several Streets where the

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water empties itself into the Harbour, so as to prevent the drift, sand and mud carried down said Streets from injuring the navigation; and to cause the said piers to be cleaned out from time to time as occasion may require; and that the expense incurred by the wardens in complying with the requisitions of this Ordinance, be paid out of any unappropriated money in the City treasury".

The following preamble and Resolution were on motion submitted Viz. "Whereas the City Council have for the purpose of distributing into other Channels the water which now flows into the Harbour at Washington Street, directed the City Commissioners, by an Ordinance passed at the present session to cause part of Wilkes Street, Washington Street, Castle Alley and County Street to be paved, and also to build banks or abutments for the purpose of preserving the navigation - And whereas it is desirable to ascertain whether this important object may not be further effected by carrying some of the water from Ann Street Westwardly - Therefore be it

Resolved by both branches of the City Council that the City Commissioners, together with the Port Wardens, be, and they are hereby directed, without delay, to cause to be made, by two competent persons in conjunction, a survey of the streets Eastward of Caroline Street, and to ascertain the most eligible place, in addition to the measures above mentioned, for distributing the water into the different streets, which now empties itself into the Harbour at the foot of Washington Street, and that they report the said survey and plan to the Council at their session in May next".

Which Preamble and Resolution having been Read the first and by special Order a second time were Concurred in and directed to be sent to the second branch for their concurrence.
