Resolved by both branches of the City Council that Edward Woodgear, James Mosher, James Wilson, John Campbell White and James Biays be and they are hereby appointed a Committee to prepare and present a Memorial in the name of the Mayor & City Council of Baltimore to the General Assembly of Maryland at its next session, firmly but respectfully maintaining the rights of this Corporation to the said Hospital and grounds, and praying a repeal of the act passed at the last session entitled "An act to incorporate the Maryland Hospital".

Which Report & Resolution having been read the first and by special Order a second time were severally concurred in and sent to the second branch for their concurrence.

On motion therefore the Branch adjourned until 3 o'clock tomorrow afternoon.

The Branch met agreeably to adjournment, present William Patterson Esquire, president, and all the other members except Messrs McCulloch & Jamison.

The Bill entitled "An Ordinance for the improvement of Harford & Wilkes Streets," was on motion read a second time and will not pass.

The following Resolution was on motion submitted & Resolved by both branches of the City Council, that the sum of two hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be added to the appropriation Bill for the present year, to repair

highways on Wilk and Harford Streets Bridge, to be expended under the direction of the City Commissioners, with the approbation of the Mayor" which being read the first and by special Order a second time, was concurred in, and sent to the second branch for their concurrence, who returned the same endorsed "disented from".

The following Resolution was received from the second branch viz: "Resolved by both branches of the City Council, that the Mayor be and he is hereby requested to cause to be affixed to the Corner House of each and every street, lane and alley in the City of Baltimore, Requiring the same, An index, shewing the name of such street lane or alley".

Which having been read the first & second time by special Order, <sup>was</sup> concurred in, and returned.

The Report of the joint Committee on the subject of the Hospital was returned from the second branch endorsed "Concurred in"

The amendment proposed by the second branch to the "Resolution making appropriation for erecting a suitable building to secure the Ordinance &c. belonging to the City and Volunteer Artillery" was on motion read a second time concurred in, and the second branch informed thereof by message.

A second communication was received from Samuel Russell on the subject of selling for the use of the City part of a Lot of ground owned by him on Green Street - Which Communication or memorial having been read, was ordered to lie on the table.

A Memorial from John Diefenderffer and others, on the subject of the Measurement of Salt, was presented read, and on motion referred to Messrs. Leving, Ruse and Mezick to consider and Report thereon.

The Bill entitled "An Ordinance for paving Wilkes Street, Washington Street, Castle Alley, and County <sup>Street</sup>" was returned from the second branch endorsed "will not pass" whereupon
