

242 City Council, Entitled "A further supplement to an Ordinance, entitled An Ordinance to prevent nuisances and to enforce useful regulations within the City of Baltimore" - And praying that the City Council will by a special exemption Relieve their property from the operation of said Ordinance" - Was presented Read and Referred to Messrs Mosher, Leary and Rife to consider and Report thereon.

The Committee to whom was referred the petition of Josias Stevenson on the subject of landing fire wood on Dugans Wharf. submitted their report by submitting a Bill entitled "An Ordinance for the benefit of Dugans & O'Donnells Tobacco Inspection Warehouses" which having been read the first time was ordered to lie on the table.

The Bill entitled "A supplement to an Ordinance entitled An Ordinance for the safe keeping of Gunpowder, within the City of Baltimore & precincts thereof" was on motion Read a second time passed and sent to the second Branch for their concurrence. - The returned the same endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment viz. Strike out from the word "panels" in the 5th line of the enacting clause to the end thereof, and insert "Of Gunpowder stored in said Magazine after the first day of August next". Which amendment on being Read was ordered to lie on the table.

An Application from Lewis Miller, soliciting the situation of Don Kasper D. Mesinger to this Branch vacated by the death of Frederick Greavy, was presented Read & Ordered to lie on the table.

The Committee appointed on the petition of Thomas H. Rice & also on that of James Boston, heretofore referred, made their Report by submitting a Bill entitled, "A further supplement to the Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance for licensing and regulating Auctions within the City of Baltimore and precincts thereof". Which being Read the first, and by special Order a second time, passed, and was sent to the second Branch for their concurrence.

The Committee appointed on that part of the Mayors Commission

243 which relates to public wharves, made Report by submitting a Bill entitled "A further additional supplement to the Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to regulate the public wharves and for the Collection of certain rates thereon". Which being Read the first time was ordered to lie on the table.

On motion therefor, the Branch adjourned until tomorrow afternoon 8 o'clock.
