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in the 5th line and insert from and after the 15th day of February Instant.
Mr Bosley moved to strike out the word two in the 5th line of the 2^d section and insert for
the Yeas and Nays being called for were as follows, Affirmative Messrs Browning, Shaffer,
Differdaffar, Stansbury, Bosley, Rapp, White, Russell, Ridgely, Reese, Curley, Cushing, and
Krebs, Nigh 15 Negative Messrs President, Clarke, Hubbard, Minfelter, Heath,
Burling, and Moore 7. So the motion prevailed.

The Bill was then put on its final passage with the proposed amendments, the
Yeas and Nays were called for and appeared as follows, Yeas Messrs President, Clarke,
Browning, Shaffer, Differdaffar, Stansbury, Bosley, Rapp, White, Heath, Burling, Rapp,
Ridgely, Curley, Cushing, Lynch, Krebs & Nigh 18 Nays Messrs Hubbard, Minfelter,
Moore and Reese 4, so the Bill will pass as amended.

The Resolution making an appropriation for the several Fire Companies was
returned from the second Branch endorsed concurred in.

The Bill entitled "An Ordinance to lay and collect a direct tax for the
year 1825" was returned from the second Branch endorsed "Will pass."

Mr Krebs presented a petition from David Williamson relative to a
nuisance in Henrietta street, which was read and referred to Messrs Krebs,
Curley and Burling.

The Bill entitled "A further supplement to An Ordinance entitled 'An
Ordinance for the regulation of fairs within the City of Baltimore,' was read
a second time, Mr Cushing moved to strike out all of the Bill after the
enacting clause, the Yeas and Nays being required were as follows Affirmative,
Messrs President, Clarke, Browning, Hubbard, Shaffer, Differdaffar, Minfelter,
Bosley, Rapp, White, Heath, Finley, Moore, Burling, Russell, Ridgely, Reese,
Curley, Cushing, Lynch & Nigh 20 Negative Mr Krebs 1. So the motion
was concurred in and the Bill being put on its final passage, will not pass.

A message was received from the second Branch, aperting to the message
from this Branch of yesterday proposing, to refer a communication from
Watchman and Dratt to the Joint Committee on a similar subject.

On Motion by Mr Clarke a message was sent to the second Branch
proposing when the City Council adjourns this evening, it adjourns to
Monday next, the second Branch concurred in the proposal and
informed this Branch thereof by message.

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Mr Heath presented a memorial from Robert Smith and others relative to the
Baltimore Monument, which was read and referred to Messrs Heath, Hubbard & Krebs.

Mr Bosley from the Committee to whom was recommended the petition of
David Brown delivered a Report which was read a first time and ordered to
lie on the table.

The Branch proceeded to consider the Bill entitled "A further supplement to
An Ordinance entitled An Ordinance to regulate the riding and driving of
horses and carriages in the City of Baltimore, when on Motion by Mr
Finley the Bill was ordered to lie on the table.

On Motion by Mr Reese the Branch adjourned until 3 o'clock Monday
Evening.
