

of Baltimore that the City Commissioners with the approbation of the Mayor cause the indexes at the corners of the several streets lanes and alleys the names whereof have been changed since such indexes have been put up to be repainted so as to show the present names of such streets lanes and alleys, and also cause new indexes to be provided where necessary, and that the sum of one hundred dollars out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury be and it is hereby appropriated to pay the expense of carrying this Resolution into effect and that the Resolution upon the same subject approved March 19th 1824 be and the same is hereby repealed.

The following Resolution was read a second time and concurred in.

Resolved by the City Council of Baltimore, that the City Commissioners and Wardens of the Port, are hereby authorized and required with the advice and consent of the Mayor, to have the earth removed from the paved part of Bough and Washington streets, at such time or times as in their opinion the safety of the navigation may require such removal, the same to be deposited on Anne street, between Bough and Wick street, and to carry this Resolution into effect, the aforesaid Commissioners are authorized to draw on the Register for such sum or sums of money as will not exceed one hundred dollars.

The Bill entitled "An Ordinance to exempt Hackney coaches from specific taxes and to entitle the owners thereof to use sleighs for hire without license," was read a second time; on motion by Mr. Cushing the Bill was ordered to lie on the table and fifty copies ordered to be printed. Done.

Mr. Minisfelter from the Committee, delivered A Report, also A Bill entitled "A further supplement to the Ordinance entitled 'An Ordinance to regulate the quaying of casks and the inspection of spirituous liquors in the City of Baltimore,' which was read a first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Cushing submitted A Resolution, relative to an application to the Legislature for a modification of the Act for the improvement of the Suquamah, which was read a first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Shaeffer from the Committee to whom was referred the Petition of Mr. Huprey and others delivered a Report also A Resolution authorizing and requiring the City Commissioners to wall up a certain part of Harford Run therein mentioned, which was read a first time and ordered to lie on the table. Done.

Mr. Finley from the Committee delivered a Report and Resolutions authorizing the Mayor to purchase a house and lot therein mentioned, which was read a first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The following Resolution was read a second time.

Resolved by the Mayor and City Council, that the Register be and he is hereby authorized to pay out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury, the sum of Five hundred dollars, to the Treasurer of the Deptford Fire Company, to liquidate a debt due by the Company, in the purchase of a suction Engine, and to assist in the purchase of a Hose.

The Resolution being put on its final passage the Yeas and Nays being required appeared as follows, Affirmatives Messrs. Clarke, Downing, Shaeffer, Hubbard, Diefendaffer, Minisfelter, Hansbury, Bosley, App. Heath, Finley, Moore, Rawlings, Russell, Ringels, Reese, Curley, Lynch 18 Nays Messrs. President, Cushing and Weeks 3. To the Resolution was concurred in.

The Bill, entitled A further supplement to An Ordinance entitled An Ordinance to regulate the riding and driving of Horses and carriages in the City of Baltimore, was read a second time and Well Yeps.

The Report of the Committee on the Petition of David Brown was read a second time, on motion by Mr. Ringels the Report was recommitted with instructions to the Committee to bring in a Bill favorable to the Petitioner.

Mr. Clarke from the Joint Committee to whom was referred that part of the Mayor's communication relative to the Harbor, delivered A Report in yard, also A Bill entitled A supplement to An Ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance for preserving the Health of the City," which was read and on motion by Mr. Clarke the Bill, Report and accompanying documents were ordered to be printed.

On Motion by Mr. Hubbard the Council adjourned until tomorrow at 3 o'clock P.M.
