

This Branch to recede from the 3 and 5th Amendments thereto. The question being put, the Branch refused their assent to the proposition and informed the second Branch thereof by message.

Mr Moore asked and obtained leave to bring in A Bill to be entitled An Ordinance, to repeal all Ordinances, imposing a tax centum to be paid by the Traders and Inspectors of liquors, Inspectors of lime and charcoal, and Inspectors of Beef and Pork, Messrs Moore, Heath and Cushing were appointed a Committee to report the same.

The Bill entitled An Ordinance to authorize David Brown to erect a stone Ware Pottery in the City of Baltimore was read a second time. Mr Heath moved that David Brown be heard in person at the Bar of the City Council upon the subject of his application, which was granted. The Bill was then put on its final passage, and the Yeas and Nays were called for were as follows Ayes Messrs Finley, Rawlings, Ridgely, Lynch and Messrs 5 Nays Messrs President, Clarke, Browning, Hubbard, Mauffrey, Diffenderffer, Klunfetter, Hubbard, Osley, Rop, White, Heath, Moore, Russell, Reese, Curley, and Cushing 17 so the Bill will not pass.

The Bill entitled A further supplement to An Ordinance entitled An Ordinance to regulate the riding and driving of horses and carriages in the City of Baltimore, was returned from the second Branch endorsed will not pass.

The Report of the Committee appointed to prepare rules for conducting business between the two Branches, was received from the second Branch read a first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr Browning moved that the Branch adjourn until to-morrow, the Yeas and Nays being called for were as follows Ayes Messrs President, Clarke, Browning, Hubbard, Diffenderffer, Klunfetter, Hubbard, Osley, and Lynch 9 Nays Messrs Mauffrey, Rop, Heath, Finley, Moore, Rawlings, Russell, Ridgely, Reese, Curley, Cushing & Messrs 12 so the motion was not concurred in.

A message was received from the second Branch proposing a Committee of conference on the Bill relative to the inspection of flour

and appointing on their part Messrs Hecox, Meekins and Burke, this Branch assented to the proposal appointed Messrs Cushing, Moore, Reese, Rop and Bosley and informed the second Branch thereof by message.

On Motion by Mr Ridgely, a message was sent to the second Branch requesting them to reconsider and pass the Bill relative to the riding and driving of horses and carriages.

On motion by Mr Clarke the Branch adjourned until 3 o'clock to-morrow Evening.

Mr Cushing from the Committee of ways and means delivered A Bill entitled An Ordinance making appropriations for the year 1825, which was read a first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion by Mr Ridgely, Messrs Ridgely, Rop and Hubbard were appointed a committee to examine the City Property in Holiday street.

Mr Heath from the Committee to whom was referred the petition of George Heide delivered an unfavorable Report and recommending that the Petitioner have leave to withdraw his petition; which report was read a first and by special order the second time and concurred in.
