The Branch met pursuant to adjournment present John D. Morris Esq. President and all the members except Messrs Macaffer, Miles, Moore & Curley.

The Bill entitled "A further Supplement to An Ordinance entitled An Ordinance to preserve the Health of the City of Baltimore and for the due performance of quarantine, was returned from the second Branch endorsed Will pass.

The Bill entitled An Ordinance to fix the salaries of certain Officers therein mentioned was read a second time and will not pass.

The Bill entitled "An Ordinance to fix the salary of the City Council was read a second time and put on its final passage, the Yeas and Nays being called for were as follows, Ayes, more, Nays Messrs President, Clarke, Browning, Hubbard, Diffenderffer, Klinefelter, Hansbury, Bosley, Rop, McWhite, Heath, Finley, Rawlings, Russell, Ridgely, Reese, Cushing, Lynch, and Krebs 19. So the Bill will not pass.

A memorial from the inhabitants of the twelfth ward on the subject of Public education, was received from the Mayor which was read and on motion by W. Krebs a message was sent to the second Branch proposing with their concurrence to refer it to a Joint Committee and naming on the part of this Branch Messrs Heath, Krebs and Clarke.

A Bill entitled An Ordinance providing for the more effectually accounting for the annual appropriations to the several Fire Companies was received from the second Branch, read a first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A message was received from the second Branch dissenting from the proposal from this Branch, requesting them to reconsider from the second amendment to the Bill to regulate the riding and driving of horses and carriages, On motion by W. Finley a message was sent to the second Branch proposing with their concurrence the appointment of a committee of conference on the same, and naming on the part of this Branch Messrs Finley, Heath and Ridgely.

The Branch proceeded to consider the Bill entitled, A Supplement to the Ordinance entitled, a further Supplement to the Ordinance entitled An Ordinance for preserving the Health of the City.

W. Krebs moved to strike out the second section, the question being called for by Yeas and Nays appeared as follows, W. Heath, on motion, being excused from voting. Ayes Messrs Russell, Ridgely, Reese, Lynch, Krebs & Wright 6 Negative Messrs, President, Clarke, Browning, Hubbard, Diffenderffer, Klinefelter, Hansbury, Bosley, Rop, McWhite, Finley, Rawlings and Cushing 13. So the motion for striking out did not prevail.

W. Cushing moved to strike out the 3^d section. Ayes Messrs President, Klinefelter, White, Russell, Ridgely, Reese, Cushing, Lynch, Krebs and Wright 10 Nays, Messrs Clarke, Browning, Hubbard, Diffenderffer, Hansbury, Bosley, Rop, Finley and Rawlings 9. So the motion prevailed and the Bill as amended being put on its final passage the Yeas and Nays being called for were as follows, Ayes Messrs President, Clarke, Browning, Hubbard, Diffenderffer, Klinefelter, Hansbury, Bosley, Rop, White, Finley, Rawlings and Cushing 13. Nays Messrs Ridgely, Russell, Reese, Lynch, Krebs and Wright 6 So the Bill will pass.

The Bill entitled An Ordinance to provide for the payment of sundry expenses of the City Court of Baltimore and of the City Poor at the Poor House, was returned from the second Branch endorsed will pass with the proposed amendments, which were read a first time & ordered to lie on the table.

The Bill entitled A Supplement to An Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance for completing the Baltimore Monument was returned from the second Branch endorsed Will not pass. On motion by W. Heath a message was sent to the second Branch returning the Bill and respectfully requesting them to reconsider and pass the same.
