The Branch met pursuant to adjournment pursuant to the order of the President and all the members except Messrs. Sheffer Niles and Moore.

Mr. Hubbard from the Committee delivered a Report and Resolution making an appropriation for Samuel Register, which was read a first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On Motion by Mr. Clarke the Branch reconsidered the Bill entitled "An Ordinance to authorize James Corner and Edmund Niles to extend a Wharf;" and on motion the Bill was recommitted.

The following Resolution was read a second time & concurred in Resolved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore that the Register of the City be and he is hereby authorized and directed to repay to the several owners of property who were assessed, for the sinking of a pump in North Howard Street, between Madison and Richmond Street, the several amounts respectively paid by them upon their producing to the Register the necessary receipts and vouchers for the same.

The Bill entitled A Supplement to An Ordinance regulating the sale of Cattle at the Centre market, was read a second time and amended and will pass.

A message was received from the Second Branch appointing to a proposal from the Branch to refer the communication from John Edwards to a joint Committee and naming on their part Messrs. Miller and Bestly.

The Report of the Chairman of the Committee of conference on the Howe Bill was received from the Second Branch, read a first and by special order the second time and concurred in.

A Resolution relative to Fire Plugs, was received from the Second Branch, read a first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Playely from the Committee to whom was referred several petitions for new lamps, delivered a Report and a Bill authorizing the erection of lamps, which was read a first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A communication from John I. Tyson Esq^r was received from the Mayor which was read, and on motion by Mr. Cushing a message was sent to the Second Branch proposing with their concurrence to refer it to the Joint Committee on the subject of public education.

A message was received from the Second Branch appointing to the H. C. P. 11, 12, 13, 16, 17, 18, 21, 22, 23 & 24 amendments to the Market Bill, and appointing from the 1, 2, 3, 5, 8, 9, 10, 13, 14, 19 & 25 amendments, and requesting this Branch to recede from the same.

Mr. Wesley from the Committee to whom were referred the petitions from Walter Crook & others, Henry Clay & others to deliver a Report and Resolution making an appropriation for repairing the Lexington Market, which was read a first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Heath presented a petition from John Carrere and others relative to the Windsor Mill road, which was read and referred to the Committee on the subject of taxes out of the limits of direct taxation.
